winner of the lincoln prize oakes brilliantly succeeds in clarifying the aims of the war with a wholly new perspective david brion davis new york review of books freedom national is a groundbreaking history of emancipation that joins the political initiatives of lincoln and the republicans in congress with the courageous actions of union soldiers and runaway slaves in the south it shatters the widespread conviction that the civil war was first and foremost a war to restore the union and only gradually when it became a military necessity a war to end slavery these two aims liberty and union one and inseparable were intertwined in republican policy from the very start of the war by summer 1861 the federal government invoked military authority to begin freeing slaves immediately and without slaveholder compensation as they fled to union lines in the disloyal south in the loyal border states the republicans tried coaxing officials into gradual abolition with promises of compensation and the colonization abroad of freed blacks james oakes shows that lincoln s landmark 1863 proclamation marked neither the beginning nor the end of emancipation it triggered a more aggressive phase of military emancipation sending union soldiers onto plantations to entice slaves away
